Hello Friends,

Over the past few months, I've made an intentional effort to speak to you all in worship about stewardship in the life of the church. I've given special attention to the financial end of it, not through an elaborate philosophical argument, but by placing the word of God before each of you at the time we take up our offering. To this date, that has meant you've been introduced to no less than 22 different Scriptures from the Hebrew Scriptures and the New Testament that give biblical reasons for our giving. And, there are more to come.

It's difficult to tell if placing these Scriptures before us is making a difference in our lives in tangible ways. We don't ask or know whether a person is giving more simply because the word of God says they should. And we don't know why a person gives to the church. And for those of you who may be wondering about me, the answer is yes, I tithe. But, I thought I would take this opportunity to share with each of you why I tithe.

I tithe to the church because it is a part of a covenant that I made with God years ago. It was a covenant that was ratified as an answer to prayer in my life. God invited me to trust beyond what I had and what I could see. But more importantly, God invited me to live in faith, doing what I should do. As a result of that faith step, I learned that I could trust God to supply all of my needs. And so, when I read the Scripture from Luke which says:

Give and it shall be given to you, a good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back. (Luke 6:38),

or from the Hebrew Scriptures,

Bring all the tithes into the storehouse so that there will be food enough in my Temple; if you do, I will open up the windows of heaven for you and pour out a blessing so great you won't have room enough to take it in! Try it! Let me prove it to you!" (Malachi 3:9-10) ...

I read those Scriptures having experienced the generous outpouring of God's grace upon my life.

I give as an act of thanksgiving to God. I don't give because I think that I can buy God's approval. I give as an act of faith. I have learned over the years that God is faithful. My giving to the church is a spiritual response to God who has provided me with everything I have. There are other reasons as well, too numerous to name here.

It is difficult to explain both the joy I have in giving and the trust that I've learned to have in God's ability to supply beyond my needs. What I want for each of you is to experience the assurance that I've realized, not because I tithe, but because God is faithful in my tithing. I pray that we might all one day arrive at the point when we can believe what God said to the prophet Malachi. My advice is, "Try it; you'll like it!"

It’s Time to Think about Summer Camp!

It doesn’t exactly feel like summer out there, but it’s time to think about summer camp at Camp Chippewa! Camp Chippewa is a Methodist summer camp that is supported by our connectional giving (apportionments). It is a great place for your children to participate in the usual camp routine such as swimming, hiking, canoeing, archery, and crafts, with the addition of daily Bible study and devotional time.

Chippewa provides a general camping experience as well as specialty camps focused on art, archaeology, drama, bike riding, horses, and water activities. Specialty camps are usually for children who have finished 5th through 12th grade. A complete listing can be found at www.campchippewa.org

Camp Chippewa has an early bird discount if you register by April 1st. You can register online by clicking on the Summer Program page, where you will find the links you need. You may also call (785) 242-6797 and ask for a full copy of registration materials to be sent to you.

Two of the camp experiences are listed below.

KAP – Faith & Fun Camps (Kids and Parents/Grandparents): for 5-year-olds through 2nd graders. This is an overnight experience for 1st-time campers and a parent or grandparent. Sessions run 7pm to 4pm and are available on a Friday/Saturday or Thursday/Friday schedule.

Faith & Fun - Gospel & Games (new for 2010) Camps – for 3rd through 12th graders: A general camping experience where kids will have a taste of all that Camp Chippewa has to offer – swimming, horseback riding, low ropes, hiking, boating, fishing, crafts, archery, cookouts, wagon ride, daily Bible Study, devotions and Worship. Gospel & Games will feature lesson time devoted to learning to use the Bible and will bring home their very own Bible. There are 3/day and 5/day sessions for 3rd/4th, 5th/6th, 7th/8th and 9th/12th grades.

We will bring descriptions of two or three camps each week in the *Messenger*. You can also come in and look at the summer brochure we have available, and help yourself to camp registration forms.

Members of Shawnee United Methodist Church are eligible for scholarships of \$50 per camper. In order to get a scholarship from the church, we need to have a copy of your completed registration form in the office by May 1st. Please copy the form before you send it off with your deposit, and fill in \$50 in the space marked “Amount from local church.” We will send a check for all campers after May 1st, so each family will need to pay the balance minus \$50 by the date due that the camp specifies.

LENTEN OFFERING

The Lenten Offering this year will be split -- 50% for Rebuilding Together Shawnee and 50% for Mission Trips. The money for Rebuilding Together Shawnee will go directly to the organization rather than to SUMC's work with them. SUMC will actually not have any direct expenses for Rebuilding Together Shawnee because the organization pays for the materials used, therefore, their need for donations. We are planning to have monthly Saturday or weekend adult mission trips to the Kansas East Conference construction projects starting early this summer.

Maundy Thursday

On Thursday, April 1, at 7:00 p.m., we will celebrate Maundy Thursday with a Passover Seder Service. This will be a symbolic Passover Seder for Christians *and will not include a full Seder meal*. The Passover Seder For Christians will honor the Hebrew tradition of Passover reminding us that Jesus was Hebrew. It will also remind us that Jesus adopted the Passover service as a sacramental remembrance of God's new work of deliverance in the Christ, and allows Christians to celebrate this ancient Hebrew festival.
