Hello Friends,

It's summer. There's no doubt about it. The heat has come and the humidity has been burdensome. Those of us who might enjoy the warmer weather have found the humidity uncomfortable. And for whatever reason, the need and the desire to be comfortable overrides our willingness to be uncomfortable in any way.

Our culture has gone a long way in making sure that comfort and ease is a huge part of our lifestyle and we've grown to like it — a lot! As one person has stated, *"we've gotten so comfortable that we don't even have to manually roll up or down the windows in our cars anymore."* Our homes and cars are climate controlled. Gone are the days when many of us even remember not having central air conditioning in our homes, or when air conditioning for the car meant getting the speed up to 40 and rolling the windows down. We enjoy being comfortable. My guess is that perhaps we have even grown comfortable in our relationship with Christ, only doing as much as we feel comfortable doing. After all, it really is about how comfortable we are.

And yet, there are certain images that reappear in Holy Scripture that call us to examine our lives of faith. One such scripture is found in the letter to the church at Philippi. In that letter Paul states that he is *"forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead"*. The image of putting behind what he has done in the past and yet working toward the promises of God, *even to the point of making himself uncomfortable*, indicates a certain responsibility on his and our part to not settle for what is comfortable.

Another scripture to offer illumination is Christ's conversations with the disciples. You can usually tell that Jesus is going to invite us to think differently, even to the point of entering that zone of discomfort when he says, *"you've heard it said before"* but then ends with, *"but, I say to you"* That's usually a strong indication that Jesus is asking us to step outside of our comfort zone and do something different.

When I answered the call to go into ministry, I was confronted with different words from Jesus, but with the same invitation to accept a different lifestyle. Jesus' words to me were, *"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? (Mark 8:34-36)"*

That demand was a radical departure from the life of comfort I had envisioned. Now, there's a word we don't hear much in the church anymore — the word radical. That word has taken on such a negative connotation that we don't want to be labeled radical. And yet that's what Christ calls us to. He calls us to lives radically different from the life we had before our encounter with him. He calls us to stretch our minds, our understanding of what it means to love others and to live for God.

In our future together, I pray that you will choose to do the work of God — work that will give us choices to be comfortable or to do something radically different for God and Christ in the world. Somehow, I think it's OK to be radical about loving God. After all, God was radical about loving us. Maybe God is our role model.

From the library... a quiet ministry

Here are some summer fiction or "beach reads" for those lingering days of August:

The Quilter's Daughter, by Wanda Brunstetter, is one of a series that takes place in an Amish community. Abby's faith is shaken by a tragedy--will she find answers looking outside her faith community?

The Secret Life of Bees, best seller by Sue Monk Kidd, is filled with wonderful characters, like three loving and unique sisters who keep bees and take in Lily, a young girl who leaves home after her mother is killed.

A Day With a Perfect Stranger, by David Gregory, focuses on a woman whose husband has recently started centering his life around Jesus (clue: his story was told in *Dinner With a Perfect Stranger*) to the point she is wondering if their marriage can continue. She becomes involved in conversation about spirituality with another passenger on an airplane and...

Sutter's Cross by W. Dale Cramer tells the story of what happens in a small, idyllic town when a tattered, somewhat grubby looking stranger comes to town and stirs the inhabitants' comfort zone about how they are living their faith.

A Skeleton In God's Closet, by Paul L. Maier, is a thriller! What would happen if a skeleton circa Jesus' lifetime and fitting His characteristics when examined by the experts were found? This book "explores the tension between doubt and faith, science and religion, and one man's determination to find the truth--no matter the cost." Happy reading!

Our author of the month for August is Nancy Moser, a resident of Overland Park, who writes some fascinating, Christian fiction. The Green Corner

Here some ideas from the Environmental Advocacy Work Area to make a difference for our environment:

- Install water-saving shower heads in all your showers.
- If you must water your lawn or outdoor plants, do it early in the morning.
- Turn your thermostats down a couple of degrees in the winter and up in the summer.
- Recycle, recycle, recycle.
- Ask for PCF (processed chlorine free) paper; buy it if they have it and encourage them to stock it if they don't have it.
- Be sure your home is adequately insulated.
- Run your dishwasher in the evening.
- Use your funny papers for wrapping gifts.
- Plant a tree – or several.
- Start a compost pile.

Flood Relief in Southeastern United States

Have you wondered what part UMCOR, United Methodist Committee on Relief, has been playing in recovery from the May floods that hit the Southeastern U.S.? These were the storms that devastated Nashville, middle and western Tennessee, western Kentucky and northern Mississippi. As usual, UMCOR was on the spot, working with the affected conferences immediately--but until recently we did not get information as to how we could be of help. And as an article in THE INTERPRETER states, "News coverage of the disaster receded faster than the flood waters." The area is still greatly suffering.
